


Birds On A Wire

There is an area in town where there are often birds on top of a telephone wire over the freeway. When Mom was in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease (and I believe she did this before her illness with my dad) she would see these birds on the wire and say, "LOOK!" Every time she saw them it was like the first time and she was always so excited. That little "LOOK!" has kind of become her trademark. You see, at her funeral, my husband said the eulogy and he told everyone the story. He asked them to think of Alice when they see birds on a wire. Friends and family have told me countless times that they have seen birds on a wire and thought of Alice. How wonderful is that?!

Birds On A Wire Lap Blanket



/// Skill Level:

- Approximately 30" x 40" Size:
- Materials: 1400 yards worsted weight yarn or 700 yards chunky weight yarn
- US #13-32" circular needle Needles:
- Right side marker, tapestry needle Notions:
- 12 stitches = 4" in garter stitch (knit every row) Gauge: 10.75 stitches = 4" in pattern stitch

Abbreviations:

k = knitk2tog = knit two stitches together by working two stitches instead of one kfb = knit into front and back of stitch p = purl

Note:

If you are using worsted weight yarn you will be double stranding the yarn throughout the pattern. If using chunky yarn you will be using it single stranded throughout the pattern.

The Pattern:

Cast on 86 stitches

Starting Border: Knit 10 rows

- Row 1: Knit across row (placing marker on this row to denote right side of lap blanket)
- Row 2: k5, p1, *k2tog until 6 stitches left, p1, k5 (49 stitches)
- Row 3: k6, *kfb across row until 6 stitches left, k6 (86 stitches)

Row 4: k5, p76, k5

Repeat Rows 1-4 until lap blanket measures 38 inches from the cast on edge, after having just finished Row 4.

Ending Border: Knit 10 rows

Finishing:

Bind off loosely.

Weave in all ends.
